


Cool Chemistry in the Classroom!

In Science this week, students explored reversible chemical changes with a hands-on (and chilly!) experiment - making ice cream. Using a mix of cream, vanilla essence and sugar sealed inside a bag of ice and salt, students shook their way to a frozen treat while learning about how heat and cold can change the state of matter.

While the final product didn't win any dessert awards - most agreed it needed a little more sugar! It was a fantastic way to see science in action. The class also discussed how this change is reversible, as the ice cream could melt back into a liquid. Delicious or not, it was a fun way to learn!

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AT SCHOOL

At Sacred Heart, we have detailed emergency procedures in place to ensure the safety of all students, staff, and visitors. These include regular drills and staff training to prepare for a range of situations:

- Evacuations are used when it's safer to be outside the buildings (e.g. fire, gas leak). Students move calmly to our designated evacuation point where rolls are marked and everyone is accounted for.
- Lock-ins (or shelter-in-place) are used when there is a potential threat outside the school (e.g. nearby police incident). In these cases, students remain safely inside classrooms with external doors secured.
- Critical incidents refer to events that have a significant impact on the school community (e.g. serious injury, natural disaster). Our Critical Incident Plan outlines the steps we take to manage and respond appropriately, including communication with emergency services and families.

We regularly review our Emergency Management Plan in line with Department guidelines and run practice drills each term to ensure everyone knows what to do. If you'd like to know more, please don't hesitate to contact the school.



Keeping Kids Safe on Our Roads

The TAC encourages parents to teach road safety from an early age. Children under 10 should always be supervised near roads.

Key tips include:

- Use "Stop, Look, Listen, Think" when crossing.
- Always exit cars on the kerbside.
- Helmets are a must for bikes and scooters.
- Practise safe walking, riding, and using public transport together.


