Cyberbullying is a form of bullying using technology such as the Internet or mobile phone. It can be shared widely and quickly with a lot of people, making this form of bullying extremely dangerous and harmful. It has become increasingly common, especially among teenagers. Cyberbullying can be identified as being repeated behaviour by an aggressor with an intent to harm or embarrass someone. This type of behaviour can include posting rumours about a person, posting direct threats or sexual remarks, even disclosing a victim's personal information. Internet trolling is another common form of cyberbullying often found in online gaming or social media circles. Internet trolls often do this to elicit a reaction or disruption from their victim purely for their own personal amusement.

## BULLYING NO WAY

Understanding Bullying – and What It Isn't

This week, we've been working through the "High 5" strategies with students: Ignore, Talk Friendly, Walk Away, Talk Firmly, and Report. These steps help children manage situations confidently, get help when needed, and build resilience.

We've also been talking about the difference between bullying and other behaviours. Many children can confuse the two. Bullying is repeated, intentional, and involves a power imbalance. Constant fighting between friends, rough play, or thoughtless comments—while still needing to be addressed—are often signs of poor social skills, not bullying. This can be especially common for students who struggle to read social cues.

Our aim is to support children to talk openly about what is happening for them at school, without rushing to label someone a "bully." By understanding the type of behaviour, we can teach the right strategies—whether that's practising kinder words, giving friends space, or seeking adult help.

Families can help by asking open questions ("What happened next?" or "How did you feel?") and encouraging their child to try the High 5 steps before the problem escalates. Together, we can build respectful, supportive relationships across our school.



## The Assumption of Mary

The Assumption celebrates the belief that Mary, the mother of Jesus, was taken body and soul into Heaven at the end of her earthly life.

This teaching honours her unique role in God's plan, her life of perfect faith, and her closeness to Christ. For Catholics, it is a reminder of the hope we share—that we too are called to eternal life with God.

Mary is often called the Virgin Mary, a title that recognises her "yes" to God's will and her openness to the Holy Spirit. It reflects the Church's belief in her purity of heart and complete trust in God's plan from the very beginning. This title is not only about a physical reality but also about her being wholly dedicated to God, free from anything that would hold her back from saying "yes" with her whole self.

On this feast, we thank God for Mary's example of love, humility, and obedience, and we ask her to pray for us so that we might follow her path of trust and faith.



Hail Mary,  
full of grace,
