#### REFERRALS & ASSESSMENTS

How We Identify and Address Learning Barriers

#### **Teacher Notices a Concern**

- Learning, behaviour, or wellbeing issue spotted in class.
- Checked against regular assessments (PAT, DIBELS, Essential Assessment, work samples).

#### **Classroom Strategies Tried**

- Teacher adjusts tasks, groups, or teaching methods.
- Support programs may be introduced (e.g., reading or maths intervention).

#### **Referral Made**

- If concerns remain, the teacher refers the student to the Learning Diversity / Wellbeing Leader.
- Data and observations are reviewed.

#### **Parent Contact**

- Parents are invited to discuss concerns.
- A plan is developed together.

#### Further Assessment (if needed)

- School-based checks (e.g., reading, numeracy, speech screeners).
- Hearing and Vision checks
- Referrals may be made to external specialists (speech, OT, psychologist).

#### **Support Plan**

- An Personal Learning Plan (PLP) or Program Support Group (PSG) meeting is set up if required.
- Goals and adjustments are agreed upon.
- Ongoing Review
- Progress is tracked each term.
- Parents are updated regularly.
- Plan adjusted as needed.

## CHILD SAFETY SPOTLIGHT



The Australian Childhood Foundation provides vital services to support children and young people who have experienced abuse, neglect, or family violence. Their programs include therapeutic foster and kinship care, trauma counselling, family support, and outreach initiatives to help children feel safe, connected, and able to heal.

Actor Chris Hemsworth, a Patron of the Foundation, has played an important role in raising awareness and funds. He led the #NotAnotherChild campaign, supported fundraising events (including one that raised over \$275,000 for a Trauma Recovery Centre), and even voiced a character in the Foundation's Big Tree App, which helps young children learn calming and coping strategies.

### SHAPING HEALTHY MASCULINITY

#### **Special Report**

Boys today are growing up in a digital world filled with mixed messages about what it means to "be a man." Too often, online spaces promote toughness and dominance while discouraging empathy and kindness. **These outdated ideas limit boys' emotional growth and can impact how they relate to others.** 

We can support boys by introducing positive role models, encouraging open conversations, and helping them see that seeking help and showing emotion are signs of strength, not weakness. Respectful relationships and cross-gender friendships also play a vital role in shaping balanced, confident young men.

The Australian Government has launched an interactive tool, <u>The Algorithm of Disrespect</u>, which helps adults understand the hidden messages young people encounter online.



"The wilderness becomes a fruitful field... The effect of righteousness will be peace, and the result of righteousness, quietness and trust forever."


