THINK UV, NOT TEMPERATURE - PROTECT YOUR SKIN

We often judge whether sun protection is needed by how hot or sunny it feels, but the real danger comes from ultraviolet (UV) radiation, which we can't see or feel.

Even on cool or cloudy days, UV levels can be high enough to damage skin. In fact, when the UV Index reaches 3 or more, that's when protection should begin.

Excess UV exposure is the main cause of skin cancer. One particularly dangerous form, melanoma, can spread to vital organs if untreated.



Be SunSmart

Check the daily UV Index
Cover up with clothing, hats, and sunglasses
Use broad-spectrum sunscreen (SPF 30+) and
reapply
Seek shade during high UV times

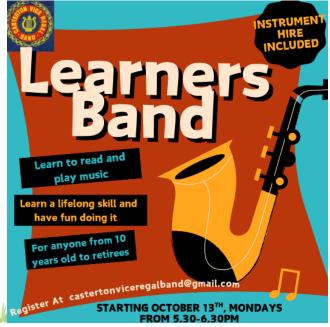
You might also like to take part by engaging in a creative activity together, talking about emotions, or exploring resources such as apps or videos that build understanding of mental health.

World Mission Month Walking with the People of Zambia



This October, Catholic Mission invites us to journey with the people of Zambia, where communities face challenges of poverty, poor infrastructure, and limited access to healthcare. In the rural Diocese of Mpika, expectant mothers often travel for hours to reach medical help, putting both their lives and their babies at risk.

Through Bishop Edwin Mulandu and local partners, Catholic Mission is working to bring hope and healing. Projects include building a mother's shelter and upgrading the Chalabesa Rural Health Centre, providing safe birthing spaces, vital equipment, and outreach health posts so women can receive care closer to home.

Beyond healthcare, Catholic Mission supports the Maize Mill Project, empowering local farmers—particularly women—with seeds, training, and fair opportunities to sell their produce. The maize grown is milled locally, improving food security and economic independence for families.

This year's theme, "Missionaries of Hope Among All Peoples," reminds us that mission is about solidarity—standing with others in love, not charity. By supporting Catholic Mission, we help create lasting change and uphold the dignity of every person.
